

Independent Auditors' Report on Compliance and on Internal Control over Financial Reporting Based on an Audit of Basic Financial Statements Performed in Accordance with *Government Auditing Standards*

We have audited the basic financial statements of the State of Arizona as of and for the year ended June 30, 2002, and have issued our report thereon dated February 11, 2003, which was modified as to consistency because of the implementation of GASB Statement No. 34, Basic Financial Statements—and Management's Discussion and Analysis—for State and Local Governments and GASB Statement No. 35, Basic Financial Statements—and Management's Discussion and Analysis—for Public Colleges and Universities and due to our reliance on the work of other auditors as described therein. We conducted our audit in accordance with U.S. generally accepted auditing standards and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in Government Auditing Standards, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States.

Compliance

As part of obtaining reasonable assurance about whether the State's basic financial statements are free of material misstatement, we performed tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts, and grants, noncompliance with which could have a direct and material effect on the determination of basic financial statement amounts. However, providing an opinion on compliance with those provisions was not an objective of our audit and, accordingly, we do not express such an opinion. The results of our tests and the work of the other auditors disclosed no instances of noncompliance that are required to be reported under *Government Auditing Standards*. However, we noted certain immaterial instances of noncompliance that we will report to various state agencies' management in separate letters.

Internal Control over Financial Reporting

In planning and performing our audit, we considered the State's internal control over financial reporting in order to determine our auditing procedures for the purpose of expressing our opinion on the basic financial statements and not to provide assurance on internal control over financial reporting. However, we noted one matter involving internal control over financial reporting and its operation that we consider to be a reportable condition. Reportable conditions involve matters coming to our attention relating to significant deficiencies in the design or operation of internal control over financial reporting that, in our judgment, could adversely affect the State's ability to record, process, summarize, and report financial data consistent with the assertions of management in the basic financial statements. This reportable condition is described in the accompanying Schedule of Findings and Questioned Costs as item 02-01.

A material weakness is a condition in which the design or operation of one or more of the internal control components does not reduce to a relatively low level the risk that misstatements in amounts that would be material in relation to the basic financial statements being audited may occur and not be detected within a timely period by employees in the normal course of performing their assigned functions. Our consideration of internal control over financial reporting would not necessarily disclose all such internal control matters that might be reportable conditions and, accordingly, would not necessarily disclose all reportable conditions that are also considered to be material weaknesses. However, we believe that the reportable condition described above is not a material weakness. We also noted other matters involving internal control over financial reporting that we will report to various state agencies' management in separate letters.

This report is intended solely for your information and that of the Chairperson and Vice Chairperson of the Joint Legislative Audit Committee, federal awarding agencies, and pass-through entities and is not intended to be and should not be used by anyone other than these specified parties. However, this report is a matter of public record, and its distribution is not limited.

Compliance

We have audited the compliance of the State of Arizona with the types of compliance requirements described in the *U.S. Office of Management and Budget* (OMB) *Circular A-133 Compliance Supplement* that are applicable to each of its major federal programs for the year ended June 30, 2002, except for that portion of the federal programs administered by the Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System, the Arizona Department of Transportation, and the Water Infrastructure Finance Authority. Those departments were audited by other auditors, and our opinion, insofar as it relates to the compliance of those departments with the types of compliance requirements described in the *OMB Circular A-133 Compliance Supplement*, is based solely on the work of the other auditors. The State's major federal programs are identified in the Summary of Auditors' Results section of the accompanying Schedule of Findings and Questioned Costs. Compliance with the requirements of laws, regulations, contracts, and grants applicable to each of its major federal programs is the responsibility of the State's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the State's compliance based on our audit and the work of the other auditors.

We conducted our audit of compliance in accordance with U.S. generally accepted auditing standards; the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards*, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States; and OMB Circular A-133, *Audits of States, Local Governments, and Non-Profit Organizations*. Those standards and OMB Circular A-133 require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether noncompliance with the types of compliance requirements referred to above that could have a direct and material effect on a major federal program occurred. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence about the State's compliance with those requirements and performing such other procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances. We believe that our audit and the work of the other auditors provide a reasonable basis for our opinion. Our audit does not provide a legal determination on the State's compliance with those requirements.

As described in the following table, the State did not comply with certain compliance requirements that are applicable to the following major federal programs. Compliance with such requirements is necessary, in our opinion, for the State to comply with requirements applicable to those programs.

In our opinion, based on our audit and the work of the other auditors, except for the noncompliance described in the preceding table, the State complied, in all material respects, with the requirements referred to above that are applicable to each of its major federal programs for the year ended June 30, 2002. The results of our auditing procedures also disclosed other instances of noncompliance with those requirements that are required to be reported in accordance with OMB Circular A-133 and are described in the accompanying Schedule of Findings and Questioned Costs as items 02-101, 02-102, 02-103, and 02-105.

Internal Control over Compliance

The State's management is responsible for establishing and maintaining effective internal control over compliance with requirements of laws, regulations, contracts, and grants applicable to federal programs. In planning and performing our audit, we considered the State's internal control over compliance with requirements that could have a direct and material effect on a major federal program in order to determine our auditing procedures for the purpose of expressing our opinion on compliance and to test and report on internal control over compliance in accordance with OMB Circular A-133.

We noted certain matters involving internal control over compliance and its operation that we consider to be reportable conditions. Reportable conditions involve matters coming to our attention relating to significant deficiencies in the design or operation of internal control over compliance that, in our judgment, could adversely affect the State's ability to administer a major federal program in accordance with applicable requirements of laws, regulations, contracts, and grants. Those reportable conditions are described in the accompanying Schedule of Findings and Questioned Costs as items 02-101, 02-102, 02-103, 02-104, 02-105, and 02-106.

A material weakness is a condition in which the design or operation of one or more internal control components does not reduce to a relatively low level the risk that noncompliance with applicable requirements of laws, regulations, contracts, and grants that would be material in relation to a major federal program being audited may occur and not be detected within a timely period by employees in the normal course of performing their assigned functions. Our consideration of internal control over compliance would not necessarily disclose all such internal control matters that might be reportable conditions and, accordingly, would not necessarily disclose all reportable conditions that are also considered to be material weaknesses. However, of the reportable conditions described above, we consider items 02-104 and 02-106 to be material weaknesses.

We have audited the State's basic financial statements as of and for the year ended June 30, 2002, and have issued our report thereon dated February 11, 2003, which was modified as to consistency because of the implementation of GASB Statement No. 34, Basic Financial Statements—and Management's Discussion and Analysis—for State and Local Governments and GASB Statement No. 35, Basic Financial Statements—and Management's Discussion and Analysis—for Public Colleges and Universities and due to our reliance on the work of other auditors as described therein. Our audit was made for the purpose of forming an opinion on the basic financial statements taken as a whole. The accompanying Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards is presented for purposes of additional analysis as required by OMB Circular A-133 and is not a required part of the basic financial statements. Such information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the basic financial statements and, in our opinion, based on our audit and the work of the other auditors, is fairly stated, in all material respects, in relation to the basic financial statements taken as a whole.

This report is intended solely for your information and that of the Chairperson and Vice Chairperson of the Joint Legislative Audit Committee, federal awarding agencies, and pass-through entities and is not intended to be and should not be used by anyone other than these specified parties. However, this report is a matter of public record, and its distribution is not limited.

Note 1 - Significant Accounting Policies

<u>Basis of Presentation</u>—The information in the schedule is presented in accordance with the requirements of OMB Circular A-133.

Reporting Entity-The schedule includes all federal awards activity administered by the State of Arizona.

<u>Basis of Accounting</u>—The federal awards reported in the schedule were presented in the State's governmental and proprietary funds and discretely presented component units on the basic financial statements of the State of Arizona for the year ended June 30, 2002; and were accounted for using the modified accrual and full accrual basis of accounting, as applicable, in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.

<u>Expenditures</u>—Certain transactions relating to expenditures of federal awards may appear in the records of more than one state grantee agency. To avoid duplication and the overstatement of the aggregate level of federal awards expended by the State of Arizona, the following policies have been adopted:

- 1. When monies are received by one state grantee agency and distributed to another state grantee agency, the federal monies are reported in the accounts of the state grantee agency that expends the monies.
- Purchases of services between state grantee agencies using federal monies are recorded as
 expenditures on the purchasing agency's records and as revenues for services rendered on
 the providing agency's records. Therefore, the receipt of federal awards is attributed to the
 purchasing agency, which is the primary receiving/expending state grantee agency.

Note 2 - Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance (CFDA)/Identifying Number

The program titles and CFDA numbers were obtained from the federal or pass-through grantor or the 2002 Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance. When a CFDA number was nonexistent or unknown, the first two digits applicable to the federal agency, if known, were used; followed by the federal contract number to identify the program. If the federal contract number was also unknown, the identifying number was composed of the first two digits applicable to the federal agency followed by the word "Unknown."

Note 3 - Research and Development Cluster

As provided by OMB Circular A-133, the research and development cluster of programs is summarized by federal agency subdivision or pass-through entity.

Note 4 - Pass-through Grantor Contract Numbers

For federal awards received by the State from a pass-through grantor, the pass-through grantor contract number is included, if applicable, immediately following the pass-through grantor's name. Pass-through grantors are italicized.

Note 5 - Loan and Loan Guarantee Programs

Only administrative costs incurred for loan and loan guarantee programs are included in the schedule. However, OMB Circular A-133, Subpart B, §205(b) requires that the current year administrative costs and loan distributions, and the balances of the previous year's outstanding student loans and loan guarantees, also be included for these programs when determining federal awards expended for single audit purposes. Further, Subpart B, §310(b)(6) requires that loans or loan guarantees outstanding at year-end be included in either the schedule or a note to the schedule. Loans and loan guarantees outstanding at June 30, 2002, are described below.

Student Loan Programs

The Universities administer the following three federal student loan programs. The current-year loan distributions and the balances of loans outstanding at year-end are shown below.

In addition, the Universities distribute loans from two federal loan programs that are administered by independent third parties. For the year ended June 30, 2002, the Universities distributed \$101,767,584 of Federal Family Education Loans (CFDA number 84.032) and \$176,925,745 of Federal Direct Student Loans (CFDA number 84.268).

Loan Guarantee Programs

The Water Infrastructure Finance Authority (WIFA), a discretely presented component unit on the State's fiscal year 2002 basic financial statements, has entered into capitalization grant agreements with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. During fiscal year 2002, the WIFA received capitalization grant monies totaling \$9,398,715 from the Capitalization Grants for State Revolving Funds (CFDA number 66.458) program and \$2,986,417 from the Capitalization Grants for Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (CFDA number 66.468) program for deposit into their revolving loan guarantee funds. Further, the balances of the federal guarantee portion of the loans outstanding for these capitalization grants were \$133,454,307 and \$42,731,540, respectively, at June 30, 2002.

Housing Program

The Department of Housing administers the HOME Investment Partnerships Program (CFDA number 14.239), which provides loans to towns, nonprofit organizations, and individuals to purchase homes and rental properties. The Department distributed \$2,795,757 in loans during fiscal year 2002 and had \$14,732,707 in loan balances outstanding at June 30, 2002.

Note 6 - Food Commodities

Food commodities received by the State are disbursed through distributing agencies. Such commodities are included in the definition of federal awards when distributed and, accordingly, are included in the amounts presented on the schedule. The State's food commodity distributions totaled \$27,763,862, and the amounts, by CFDA number, are presented as follows:

Note 7 - Donation of Federal Surplus Personal Property

The value of the Donation of Federal Surplus Personal Property program (CFDA number 39.003) reported on the schedule is based on a "market basket formula" developed by the U.S. General Services Administration. This "market basket formula" represents 23.3 percent of the original federal acquisition cost, totaling \$181,118 for the year ended June 30, 2002.

Note 8 - Immunization and HIV Grants

The Immunization Grants (CFDA number 93.268) expenditures of \$21,969,468 include \$17,910,461 worth of vaccines. The HIV Care Formula Grants (CFDA number 93.917) expenditures of \$8,136,507 include \$5,884,512 worth of vaccines. Vaccines administered by the Department of Health Services are included in the definition of federal awards and, accordingly, are included in the amount presented on the schedule.

Note 9 - Unemployment Insurance (CFDA No. 17.225)

The unemployment compensation system is a unique federal-state partnership, founded upon federal law, but implemented through state law. As prescribed by the U.S. Department of Labor in consultation with the Office of Management and Budget, certain state monies, in addition to federal monies, were considered federal awards for determining Type A programs, and were included in the Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards.

The State's Information Services Division has not completed a Disaster Recovery Plan

The State's Information Services Division operates the State's computer system. Should that system fail, the State would be unable to process critical transactions necessary to ensure its daily operations. The Division has begun work on a project to develop a disaster recovery plan, called a business continuity plan, for all its core information systems. However, as of the 2002 fiscal year-end, the Division has not completed a formal plan for processing critical jobs in the event of a major hardware, software, or telecommunications failure. This is similar to a prior-year finding that has not been corrected.

To help ensure that critical jobs can be processed in the event of a major hardware, software, or telecommunications failure, the Information Services Division should complete its business continuity plan as soon as possible. The plan should include a formal equipment backup agreement that contains the following requirements:

- Machine time availability
- Application-processing priorities
- Information exchanges regarding equipment configuration/system software changes
- Testing procedures
- Cost
- Voice and data communication recovery

A formal backup agreement could be costly to the State; therefore, the Information Services Division should evaluate the cost/benefit and feasibility of entering into a consortium with other states that have similar accounting systems to negotiate a formal equipment backup agreement with an outside vendor. This could help to reduce the State's overall cost.

Finally, a copy of the business continuity plan should be maintained at a secure off-site location and updated when changes occur.

The Department received the subrecipients' audited SEFAs and performed a reconciliation of the grant revenue amounts the Department passed through to the counties with the related grant expenditure amounts the counties reported on their schedules. One of the 15 counties did not record any expenditures on its SEFA for the Immunization Grant monies received from the Department and another county recorded the monies under the wrong CFDA number. The Department did not contact the counties to inform them of these discrepancies.

It was not practical to extend our auditing procedures sufficiently to determine questioned costs, if any, that may have resulted from this finding. This finding is a reportable condition and immaterial noncompliance with the program's subrecipient monitoring requirements.

To comply with OMB Circular A-133, §.400 (d), the Department should ensure expenditures related to federal grant monies passed through from the Department are properly reported on its subrecipients' SEFAs.

During the grant application process, the Arizona Department of Education submits average per pupil expenditure data to the National Center for Educational Statistics using the National Public Education Survey form.

The Department did not have adequate procedures to ensure that it prepared the National Public Education Survey accurately since there were several errors on the Survey submitted by the Department on September 1, 2002. Specifically, revenue from intermediate sources was understated by \$158,862,880, revenue from state sources was understated by \$424,664,802, and operations and management-other expenditures were understated by \$3,000,000. The net effect of these errors would potentially overstate per pupil expenditures and the State's allotment for the 2004 award year. Further, the Department submitted adjustments subsequent to the initial filing of the Survey that were not supported.

It was not practical to extend our auditing procedures sufficiently to determine questioned costs, if any, that may have resulted from this finding. This finding is a reportable condition and immaterial noncompliance with the program's reporting requirements.

To help ensure compliance with the reporting requirements of the program, the Department should implement policies and procedures to ensure the National Public Education Survey is accurate and all adjustments are properly supported.

The Department allowed subrecipients to accumulate up to 4 percent of their budgeted awards as excess cash, and this accumulated excess cash was not returned to the Department until the subrecipients submitted their annual completion reports to the Department on September 30. None of the subrecipients selected for test work had cash that exceeded 4 percent of their budgeted awards or excess cash that was not returned to the Department by September 30.

It was not practical to extend our auditing procedures sufficiently to determine questioned costs, if any, that may have resulted from this finding. This finding is a reportable condition and immaterial noncompliance with the programs' cash management requirements. This instance of noncompliance with cash management requirements is similar to a prior-year finding.

To help ensure compliance with cash management requirements, the Department should require subrecipients to conform to the same standards of timing and amount for the drawdown of federal monies as prescribed in the Cash Management Improvement Act agreement between the State of Arizona and the Secretary of Treasury.

It was not practical to extend our auditing procedures sufficiently to determine questioned costs, if any, that may have resulted from this finding. This finding is a material weakness and material noncompliance with the program's subrecipient monitoring requirements.

To comply with OMB Circular A-133, §.400 (d)(4) and 7 CFR §251.10(e), the CSA should assign a program supervisor to review the vendor or subrecipient determination and develop a system to select subrecipients for an annual review.

The Department has fully corrected the finding regarding the submission of cash management reports. The Department reviewed policy and procedures and implemented a policy that took effect on July 1, 2001 requiring all federal projects (irrespective of budget total) to submit monthly cash management reports until such time as the grant/project funding is reported by the subrecipient as fully expended. If the subrecipient subsequently discovers funds belonging to the project during the project year (a refund, for example), the subrecipient must resume reporting until the funds are again reported as fully expended, or remit the excess cash to the Department.

With respect to the excess cash portion of the finding, the Arizona Department of Education will implement by July 1, 2003 a policy that allows subrecipients to request an amount not to exceed one month's administrative expenses. Any excess of cash balance must be adjusted or returned to the Department.

DOCUMENTATION ON DRAWS

On a daily basis each grant and phase will be confirmed in the Arizona Financial Information System (AFIS). The agency fiscal service specialists will monitor assigned grants and determine their daily needs. If funds are available, AFIS screen-prints will be printed and the fiscal service specialist will indicate if the funds have been obligated by identifying the claim number or the Federal Grants Administration and Payment System (GAPS) batch number they are obligated to on the AFIS screen print.

If excess cash is on hand the fiscal service specialist handling the draw downs will use excess funds for other programs' cash needs during the daily draw down. The fiscal service specialist who is responsible for the daily draws of Federal funds will be required to document each programs needs and the transfer of excess funds from one Federal program to another Federal program by attaching AFIS screen prints and/or transfer forms to the actual draw down document. The A/R manager is responsible for reviewing and signing off on all draw downs indicating all required documentation is attached and the draw has been processed in accordance with the Cash Management Improvement Act.

Once the following procedures are further implemented, this finding will be fully corrected.

- 1.) An AFIS print screen copy or transfer form will be attached to the draw down document.
- 2.) Deposit date will be referenced to the original deposit on the AFIS 66A screen print.

The Department of Education anticipates that this finding will be fully corrected by July 1, 2003.
